The prevalent location of the activity will be the Department of Classical Philology and Italian Studies
– via Zamboni 32, 40126 Bologna.

Article 1 – Duration, Subject Matter and Place of Performance

The appointment will be for a period of 12 months and will be carried out within the framework of the research project entitled “Translations, Censorship, and Comparisons: The Problematical and Challenging Reception of Dante’s Comedy in the Arabian World.” The estimated workload amounts to approximately 200 hours in total. The contract is expected to commence on 1 January 2027, subject to any circumstances of force majeure. The gross remuneration for the appointment amounts to €22,699.96 per year.

Project Objectives

The reception of Dante’s Comedy in the Arab world is a subject of extraordinary critical, theoretical, and cultural interest, both because of the importance and prestige of Dante’s poem within the canon of Western culture and because of the problematic nature arising from the negative and unacceptable portrayal of the Prophet that it presents. Hence the repeated cases of translation into Arabic, beginning in the 1930s, which coexist with phenomena of censorship and the complex management of the poem’s “blasphemy.” To these issues must be added the complex debate sparked by Asín Palacios’s book on the alleged Islamic sources of Dantean eschatology, published in 1919. Within such a framework, the aim of this project is to explore certain aspects of the reception of Dante’s poem in the Arab world, including translations, phenomena of censorship and rejection, critical comparisons, and forms of intertextuality.

Place of Performance

The activities will be carried out primarily at the Department of Classical Philology and Italian Studies (FICLIT), or at other University facilities as required for the successful implementation of the project.

Only scholars who meet at least one of the following criteria may apply for this Call:

- citizens/residents of Gaza, the West Bank, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, or Iran; or
- refugees from Gaza, the West Bank, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, or Iran; or
- refugees residing in Gaza, the West Bank, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, or Iran; or internally displaced persons originating from Gaza, the West Bank, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, or Iran; or
- holders of a permanent residence permit in Gaza, the West Bank, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, or Iran.

Applicants must also demonstrate an academic background suitable for carrying out the proposed research activities and hold a:

- Second-cycle Degree (Master's Degree) in LM-14 (Italian Studies and European Literary Cultures), LM-37R (Modern, Comparative and Postcolonial Literatures), or an equivalent foreign qualification,
- or a PhD in Comparative Literature.

Applicants holding an equivalent foreign qualification must submit documentation enabling the Selection Committee to assess its equivalence solely for the purpose of admission to the selection procedure.

The following persons are not eligible to participate in this selection procedure:

- permanent staff members of universities, public research organisations, and institutions whose postgraduate scientific diploma has been recognised as equivalent to a doctoral degree pursuant to Article 74(4) of Presidential Decree No. 382 of 11 July 1980;

Applications submitted under this Call are not eligible to receive, concurrently, any other funding provided by the University of Bologna for incoming mobility in the academic year 2026/2027.

Article 3 – Application Procedure

Applications for participation in the selection procedure must be submitted exclusively online via the website: <https://concorsi.unibo.it> following personal registration as indicated in the online application system.

The application deadline is **10 September 2026 at 23:59 (Europe/Brussels time)**. Late submissions will not be accepted and will result in exclusion from the selection procedure.

The date of submission shall be certified by the electronic receipt issued to the candidate through the online system.

In the application form, candidates must declare under their own responsibility:

The final score, up to a maximum of 100 points, shall be determined on the basis of the assessment of qualifications and publications as follows:

- c) publications, assessed in terms of originality, innovation, methodological rigour, relevance, and coherence with the research project: up to 30 points;
- d) other qualifications related to previous research activities (e.g. participation as speaker at conferences and academic meetings, awards and research prizes, scholarships, fellowships etc.), duly certified: up to 10 points.

Eligibility is achieved with a minimum final score of 70/100.

the event of a tie, preference shall be given to the younger applicant. The ranked list shall be submitted for approval to the Department Board at its first available meeting.

The successful candidate and eligible candidates on the ranking list shall receive the decree approving the acts by email.

The selected candidate shall be required to enter into a Welcome Agreement (convenzione di accoglienza) with the Department of Classical Philology and Italian Studies.

Article 6 – Remuneration and Conditions

The gross total remuneration for the entire duration of the contract amounts to €22,699.96 (twenty-two thousand six hundred ninety-nine/96cents), inclusive of taxes and social security contributions payable by the contractor under applicable law.

The Department of Classical Philology and Italian Studies shall cover enrolment in the Italian National Health Service (Servizio Sanitario Nazionale - SSN).

Following the signing of the Welcome Agreement, the Department shall provide the successful applicant with the documentation necessary to apply for a research visa and, upon arrival in Italy, for a residence permit.

It shall remain the responsibility of the Visiting Scholar to enter and reside in Italy in compliance with immigration regulations applicable to research activities at the University of Bologna (<https://intranet.unibo.it/ateneo/web2/Pagine/VisitingDocentiRicercatoriStudiosiNonUeIngressoSoggiorno.aspx>).

Remuneration shall be paid in monthly instalments upon certification by the academic supervisor that the planned activities have been duly carried out.

During their stay in Bologna, the Visiting Scholar is required to obtain insurance coverage against personal accidents and third-party liability (civil liability insurance, RCT), which may be taken out through the University's insurance broker. The RCT coverage shall be limited to the activities specified in the agreement concluded with the Visiting Scholar and carried out within the Department's facilities.

The reception of Dante's Comedy in the Arab world is a subject of extraordinary critical, theoretical, and cultural interest, both because of the importance and prestige of Dante's poem within the canon of Western culture and because of the problematic nature arising from the negative and unacceptable portrayal of the Prophet that it presents. Hence the repeated cases of translation into Arabic, beginning in the 1930s, which coexist with phenomena of censorship and the complex management of the poem's "blasphemy." To these issues must be added the complex debate sparked by Asín Palacios's book on the alleged Islamic sources of Dantean eschatology, published in 1919. Within such a framework, the aim of this project is to explore certain aspects of the reception of Dante's poem in the Arab world, including translations, phenomena of censorship and rejection, critical comparisons, and forms of intertextuality.
